# champion

#### FOR STRONGER COMMUNITIES

- Continued to lead the lobbying effort to secure funding to widen I-25 to 3 lanes between Highway 14 and Highway 66 (Fix North I-25)
  - Efforts by area leaders over the past several years, including the Chamber, have resulted in \$937 million being committed to North I-25.
     There have been several major wins in 2019:

The Fix North I-25 Business Alliance, with the financial backing of investors in Northern Colorado Prospers, helped **secure \$300M in state General Fund expenditures for transportation.** 

The Alliance and other area leaders successfully lobbied the Colorado Transportation Commission to convert work on Segments 7 and 8 (Highway 14 in Fort Collins to Highway 402 Loveland) from an interim to permanent alignment and provided an additional \$310M to do so. This preserves the median for future transit options and the construction standards are higher meaning future maintenance issues will be delayed.

- Launched WorkinNorthernColorado.com as well as talent recruitment and development tools and programs for employers. Since the launch, more than 10,000 jobs have been posted.
- Supported appropriately resourced and led local government. After extensive study, the Chamber backed the renewal of the "Keep Fort Collins Great" tax.
- Led the successful campaign to defeat a ballot measure that would have converted the City Council from citizen volunteer legislators to fulltime, full-pay politicians.
- Advocated for the importance of business to community success with the Bringing Business Home Community Campaign with over 3 million viewer impressions.
- Championed affordable, reliable electricity. The Chamber convened an alliance of business organizations called the Northern Front Range Electricity Task Force to defend and promote public policy that preserves the area's advantage of electricity that is highly reliable, relatively affordable, and generated in way that is increasingly clean.

The Chamber supports business growth in two broad ways: by providing information, connections and services to help our members grow; and by tackling issues that impact the business climate. A few of our 2019 activities included:

- Stood up for business with a full-time lobbyist in Denver and by representing business locally at City Hall and the County.
- With other partners, personally met with dozens of area primary employers to discuss their needs and expansion plans. In February the partnership published its first Northern Colorado Business Retention and Expansion Annual Report.
- Celebrated small business with the 2019
   Chamber Small Business of the Year Awards:
  - Technical Framework small category (1-10 employees).
  - All Star Cleaning Services medium category (11-50 employees).
- Charco Broiler Restaurant large category (51-200 employees).

- Snack Attack Specialty Sandwiches & Brews – New Kid on the Block category (business in operation for less than three years).
- Hosted 5 Signature Events for a regional audience.
- Held networking and educational events: Business After Hours, 12@12 Luncheons, Leads Groups, Red Carpet, Fridays at the Chamber and Envision.
- Hosted National Best-Selling Author, Dan Health as the 2019 Thought Leader Speaker.

- Hosted first NoCo Housing NOW Housing Conversation that provided insight into issues that are impacting the attainability of housing.

## **2020 PLAN**

#### • Implement Year 4 of Northern Colorado Prospers:

- Elevate our work to influence public policy that will impact business and the economy with a bolder advocacy communications and lobbying plan and good candidates for city council (Bold Voice of Business).
- Continue to lead the effort to secure funding to widen I-25 to 3 lanes between Highway 14 and Highway 66 (Fix North I-25).
- Help businesses find the workers they need by: supporting the existing partnerships for manufacturing and health care, helping launch the new trades sector partnership, setting staffing plan for Talent 2.0, marketing WorkInNorthernColorado.com, and launching a new talent pipeline development initiative (Align, Attract and Retain Talent).
- Proactively contact and help existing primary employers (Business Retention & Expansion).
- **Northern Colorado Prospers II** complete feasibility work and decide whether to conduct a fund-raising campaign to continue the work of Northern Colorado Prospers.
- Secure reaccreditation.
- **Generate \$600,000 and 100 new members** during 10th annual *Moving Fort Collins Forward!* campaign.
