# CO-CHAIR LETTER

The Healthcare Sector Partnership celebrated its 10th anniversary as a regional sector partnership. The celebration highlighted ten years of collaboration and accomplishments. Senator Hickenlooper sent a video of congratulation that was shown at the celebration. We experienced another year of continued growth, increased collaboration and success in connecting with our healthcare industry leaders in 2023. With direction from our Leadership Team and committee representation, we have broadened our impact through industry voice and perspective.

One of the highlights of the year was the Nurse Well Being Conference held in February. Over 150 nurses, students and educators from the region attended a conference dedicated to personal well-being and elevation of the nursing profession.

The Partnership produced our second Healthcare in Your Future Summit. Topics presented at the summit included the use of artificial intelligence in healthcare billing, virtual reality, weight loss drugs, ageism, and dementia care. This event is a primary way the Healthcare Sector Partnership convenes the business community around healthcare issues and opportunities as we present leading experts to discuss topics that impact industry partners in Northern Colorado.

The nursing consortium of healthcare providers and education leaders are continuing to address the nursing shortage and provide actionable ways that can be implemented to address this crisis. Work this year included preceptor education and the Nurse Well Being Conference.

The Behavioral Health subcommittee convened providers and students to present viable career opportunities in behavioral health. In the spring, the fourth annual Behavioral Health Exploration event was held at CSU, funded by a grant from Larimer County Behavioral Health Services. Walk the Talk videos were produced and aired on social media sites and were well viewed.

With generous grants from The Weld Trust and the City of Fort Collins, Get Into the Guts hosted by the Workforce Committee continues to grow. Through these grants, work-based learning opportunities and informational sessions with multiple school districts in our region also continue to increase in scope and collaboration.

As we move into 2024, we are excited to hear about our two grant applications. The CWDC grant would expand our career exploration events into rural areas of our region. The Opportunity Now Planning grant would fund an extensive "refresh" or strategic planning process for the Partnership, determining the next industry-focused Partnership initiatives.

Thank you to all of the members of the Healthcare Sector Partnership for your support and participation in 2023. We look forward to continued outreach and growth in 2024!

# 2023 Achievements and Initiatives Summary

#### Informational Sessions

 High school students were involved with healthcare industry in learning about career options and pathways.

## Get into the Guts Program

- 500 students served in the 2023 school year in both Larimer and Weld County middle schools.
- Industry-Education Nursing Consortium

## Initiative #1 - Nurse well-being

**Curricula -** The consortium education partners completed a literature review of evidence/best practices for how to instill elements of well-being, resilience, and coping into our undergraduate curricula. The review was sent to all regional programs which have been incorporated as best practices as appropriate for the different programs.

**Nurse Well-Being Conference** - The consortium hosted the first Nurse Well Being Conference attended by over 150 nurses and students. The event began with Chief Nursing Officers thanking the nurses and ended with three patients thanking the nurses for saving their lives. Sessions provided by Kathleen Flarity, DNP, Research Nurse Scientist, Bryan Sexton, PhD, and CSU Trauma and Resilience department. Breakouts covered the "Ripple Effect" and "Tools for Personal Capacity."

## Initiative #2 - Clinical Instruction

All education and industry partners agreed that clinical instruction is going well, but that the partnership could help boost instruction through additional training of clinical faculty. A grant proposal was submitted requesting resources for training and boosting incentives for practicing nurses to become a clinical faculty, however, the grant was not funded. The committee decided to move forward with development of instructor training without the grant. A list of topics for clinical faculty training were generated and a conference is currently in development to support the clinical faculty training for all partners. The conference is scheduled for August 6th, 2024, to be held at the Columbine Drake Center.

At the end of the most recent session, the next prioritized topics were discussed, including mentoring, but definition and a gap have not yet been identified.

All regional partners identified this past month that the critical situation of the nursing shortage has lessened and that new grad residency program numbers are returning to pre-covid levels.

## Poudre School District Educator Externship Program

The Poudre School District Educator Externship Program is designed to provide a paid opportunity for educators to work with local businesses to gain additional expertise in their content area. Educator externs are also expected to learn about academic pathways into these sectors and industries, updated practices, trends, and bring this knowledge into practice in ways to tangibly impact students.

Business partners provide 40 hours of experience over the course of the externship. Experiences may include job shadowing, interviews with staff, project support, facility tours, etc. Business partners and educator externs are asked to meet at the start of the externship to create an experience which supports both parties.

The Health Sector Partnership was proud to help support businesses with hosting an educator extern to help give real world experience to educators so they can better share about careers in those industries with their students.

# **OUTREACH AND AWARENESS COMMITTEE**

The Outreach and Awareness Committee has gone through an evolution the past year culminating in a change in name and focus to become the Health Sector Partnership's Development Committee, led by Jonas McKinley. Carol Salter has joined as Co-Chair and this Committee will be focused on the long-term sustainability of the organization through fundraising.

In 2023, the Committee raised \$13,000 in direct sponsorships, \$26,250 in sponsorships of the 2023 Health Care in Your Future Summit and continues to receive funds toward the 2024 Nurse Wellbeing Conference. These funds are necessary to maintain administrative support that allows our partnership of volunteers to focus on the work of supporting the health care industry in Northern Colorado.

The Committee also guided the transition of the Health Sector website from Wordpress to Wix, modernizing the look and feel and making navigation more intuitive on web and mobile browser.

In 2024, the Committee will be focused on broadening our base of financial support to ensure we have the resources necessary for a successful Health Sector Partnership Refresh.
