Responsibilities:

- Create a positive classroom environment built on success and high expectations for student achievement, risk-taking, goal-setting, actions and responsibility. Carefully plan units and daily instruction.
- Maintain close communication with parents.
- Organize and prepare our students for Special Programs: Christmas Program, Spring Concert, and other events. This includes being in charge of decor, logistics, and communication with parents regarding costumes.
- Work as a team in constant communication with other teachers to coordinate events.
- Teach music to K-8th grade students. Assist preschool/pre-K with input if needed.
- Carry out the mission and goals of the school.
- Build positive relationships with adults and children in the school.
- Model a respect for students and staff of all backgrounds and cultures.
- Be positive about children in communication with students and parents.
- Support the events that build community.
- Actively participate in ongoing dialogue about liberating education that works to change the status quo of the larger community.
